## **ARTIST BIO - RORY O'CHEE**

Rory O'Chee is a very exciting photographer who brings a unique and uncompromising perspective to landscape and still life photography. His work is unfiltered. He finds ways to let the landscape speak for itself, very much as Ansel Adams did, and the results are breathtaking.

Born with Down Syndrome in 1998, Rory was originally attracted to photography as a medium to express his creativity, since his fine motor skills are restricted by his Down Syndrome. Once he realised what could be achieved with the camera, Rory set about using photography to tell stories that other people do not see.

His photographic practice based on quintessential focus, free from distraction or superfluous elements in the composition.

This approach has been very successful, winning him a slew of awards, as well as critical acclaim for his work. He is also painstakingly patient in creating his work. His most recent exhibition, "The Untouched Canyon", was the exhibition is the culmination of two years work photographing a vast outback landscape that had never before been photographed by a professional photographer. This involved traversing dirt mustering tracks, and hiking across country to reach hidden valleys and spectacular peaks.

"The beauty of The Untouched Canyon is how vast the landscape is. I have tried to show this, and to take people there, through my photography," he says.

He had two prior exhibitions. His first was "Australian Summer" in 2015. In 2017 he exhibited "Open Soul of the Sea" with the support of Art From the Margins at the Brisbane Institute of Art.

Rory has been a finalist in the Brisbane Art Prize in 2017, a finalist in the Stanthorpe Art Prize in 2018, as well as a semi-finalist in the Moran Contemporary

Photographic Prize. He has previously won Visioning the Outdoors and the My World Photo Competition.

Rory holds an Advanced Diploma in Digital Imaging from Southbank TAFE, and is currently completing a Bachelor of Fine Art from Canberra University. No Australian

with Down Syndrome has previously been admitted to study an undergraduate degree.
